

## SPANISH 109 BEGINNING SPANISH I

#### **BULLETIN INFORMATION**

SPAN 109 – Beginning Spanish I (3 credit hours)

## **Course Description:**

Introduction to grammar and practical vocabulary necessary for fundamental communication skills. Admission to SPAN 109 is reserved exclusively for those who have never studied Spanish or have not studied Spanish within the past five (5) years, or have placed into this class according to the results of the Phase I placement exam. Please note the following: 1) admission to SPAN 110 is reserved exclusively for those who have successfully completed SPAN 109; 2) SPAN 109 is offered only during the fall and summer I sessions; 3) SPAN 110 is offered only during the spring and summer II sessions; 4) credit may be earned only for SPAN 109 and SPAN 110, or SPAN 111, or SPAN 121.

## SAMPLE COURSE OVERVIEW

This course has a two-fold goal: to prepare you to use Spanish to communicate with others in a basic way and to explore various aspects of the cultures of the Spanish-speaking world through readings and videos.

#### ITEMIZED LEARNING OUTCOMES

#### Upon successful completion of Spanish 109 students will be able to:

- Understand and respond appropriately to some simple questions in the present time frame about everyday topics: one's name and similar biographical information, pastimes, family, classes, campus life, furniture and accommodations, and household chores and activities;
- 2. Demonstrate understanding of the main idea and many details of short written and audio texts specially prepared for learners on common topics: greetings, language, stereotypes, sports, and the Hispanic community;
- 3. Demonstrate recognition and understanding of basic vocabulary, such as numbers, days of the week, family members, classroom objects, classes, conditions/emotions, pastimes, household items/furniture/activities, and colors;
- 4. Demonstrate understanding of and begin to apply in communicative contexts the basic grammatical structures of Spanish, such as adjective-noun agreement, possessive and

descriptive adjectives, present indicative tense, and formation of questions/use of interrogative words; and

5. Demonstrate familiarity with cultural information related to Hispanic communities in the United States, Mexico, and Spain.

## SAMPLE ASSIGNMENTS AND/OR EXAMS
