

U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services' regulations require universities to certify that international students have sufficient funding to pursue a course of study. The University of South Carolina therefore requires international applicants to present documentation of adequate **liquid** financial resources to cover all expenses at the University for their first academic year of study. The amount for which a student must financially certify is only an **estimate**. **This form has been developed for use by the University of South Carolina only. Check with your U.S. embassy or consulate to determine what documentation you need for your interview.**

Acceptable forms of certification (must be in English)

- Checking or savings accounts
- Certificates of deposit (CDs) with a maturity date prior to the start of the student's term of admission
- Money market accounts
- A scholarship through the University, the student's home government, or a non-governmental agency
- Offer letter for a graduate assistantship/fellowship
- Educational loans

Unacceptable forms of certification

- Any document that is not written in English
- Stocks or Bonds
- Mutual funds
- Business Bank Accounts
- Statements of earned salary or yearly income
- Tax returns
- Credit card statements/lines of credit
- Statements of property ownership
