The program focuses on the theory and practice of criminal justice and combines data science, statistics, and crime prevention strategies to address public safety challenges. Learn crime pattern recognition techniques to provide insights to guide effective law enforcement and community planning.

Advanced students in the criminal justice program may apply to the Accelerated Bachelor's/Master's Study Plan to earn up to 9 credit hours of graduate-level coursework in Criminal Justice while completing the undergraduate degree.

Curriculum

The curriculum includes coursework in the following topics:

- Criminal Justice Foundations (crime, policing, corrections, courts, and victim advocacy) - 15 credit hours
- Statistics 3 credit hours
- Ethics 3 credit hours
- Crime Analysis Concentration 15 credit hours
- Research Methods and Capstone Project 6 credit hours

Prerequisites and Requirements

To apply for this online degree program, students must have earned 30 credit hours from a regionally accredited institution with a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA in all previous college-level coursework. Students transferring to the program are encouraged to review the list of recommended courses on the program's webpage.
