Curriculum

Prerequisites and Requirements

To apply for this online degree program, students must have a preferred 2.75 cumulative GPA in all previous college-level coursework. In addition to 45-60 credit hours from a regionally accredited institution, students transferring to the program are encouraged to review the list of completed coursework needed for eligibility on the program's webpage.
