Psychedelic therapy is reshaping the future of mental health care, raising profound questions about healing, identity, and human potential. In this talk, we'll explore the evolving landscape of psychedelic research and practice in the United States, highlighting ethical, and safety considerations along the way. Together, we'll look at how preparation and integration support lasting change, with special attention to the unique therapeutic needs of military and special operations veterans navigating trauma, identity, and life transitions. We'll close by reflecting on what this emerging field can teach us about consciousness, resilience, and improved well-being.

#### Upon completion, participants will be able to:

- Understand the evolving landscape of psychedelic therapy in the United States, including cultural, ethical, and safety considerations.
- Examine the role of preparation and integration practices in supporting participant well-being before and after psychedelic experiences.
- Explore the unique therapeutic needs of military and special operations veterans, and how psychedelic-assisted therapy may address trauma, identity, and transition challenges.
- Reflect on the broader implications of psychedelic research for consciousness, healing, and well-being.

## **Writing Tip: APA Title Page**

Did you know there is a difference between a student paper title page and a professional paper title page? Student papers list the course, instructor, and due date beneath the author's affiliation, while professional papers replace this with an author note. Both versions require the paper title, author name, and institutional affiliation centered on the page with a page number in the top right corner.
